To receive licensure by completing the following program of study, students must have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university and hold a current or expired initial teaching certification or license. Students must complete prerequisite courses prior to applying for the licensure-only program and taking required Special Education courses. Completion of this program leads to eligibility for licensure in the state of Ohio. Candidates must also pass the OAE examinations, meet appropriate FBI and BCI requirements, and formally apply for the license. Students who completed a reading series for their initial licensure may petition to have these courses waived.
